

**CA Regional CGA Committee Minutes  
Virtual Meeting  
August 20, 2020**

**Objective:**

The primary mission of California Regional Common Ground Alliance (CARCGA) is to eliminate safety risks to life, health, and property while also preventing damage to underground infrastructure and vital public services.

CARCGA will accomplish this mission by: encouraging stakeholders to accept and fulfill their shared responsibility in damage prevention; welcoming all stakeholders within California and encouraging their participation in CARCGA; educating members and non-members regarding Common Ground Alliance Best Practices; identifying issues concerning damage prevention and attempting to construct practices to resolve them; exchanging ideas and information with other CGA Regional Partners.

When a new damage prevention practice is created, CARCGA may forward the practice on to the CGA Best Practices Committee for their consideration. CARCGA's efforts in damage prevention will help eliminate damages to underground infrastructure, interruption to vital services, safety risks, accidents and fatalities.

When citing examples of incidents, please refer to the parties involved anonymously.

**1. Call to Order:**

Marshall Johnson called the meeting to order at 9:34 a.m. and read the objective.

**2. Attendance – See sign in sheet at end**

**3. Review Minutes from Previous Meeting**

Marshall asked for a motion to approve the minutes that had been previously emailed. Shawn Nesgis moved to accept the minutes and Anthony Headley seconded. Hearing no objections, the minutes were approved as emailed.

**4. Dig Safe Board Update**

Tony Marino updated everyone on the new laws and regulations that went into effect on July 1, 2020:

- Reporting of damages to gas lines, high priority lines, if a person was injured and sent to a treatment facility or if there was a fatality to the Dig Safe Board within two hours of the incident through a web portal that can be found on the notification centers websites or the Dig Safe Board website;
- Area of Continual Excavation (ACE) tickets for agricultural and flood control work;
- Electronic Positive Response (EPR) becomes mandatory January 1, 2021 unless an extension is given for good cause by the Dig Safe Board (applications for extensions opened on July 1 and must be submitted by October 1, 2020);
- Operators are to provide valid contact information to the regional notification centers

He said that the use of something other than hand tools to expose lines will probably go into effect October 1, 2020. Tony also said that there have been 13 notices of probable violations handed out and the Board is looking at the fee regulations. He said that on August 27<sup>th</sup> there would be a workshop for reasonable care for trenchless excavation and those that wanted to attend would need to register. Aaron Rezendez asked about the forms needed for ACE

tickets. Tony said that there had been general outreach, but they were trying to develop a process for how a farmer needs to get a ticket and build a process for the centers to have an “ag” friendly ticket. Bob Carpenter asked if there was anything that could be done to push the regulation for allowing something other than hand tools to expose lines. Tony said it’s behind the scene with fiscal and the office of administrative law. He said non-emergency regulations are approved with either a January, April, July or October effective date. He said it might be possible if the October 1 date is pushed by a few days that it could go into effect immediately, but they should know by mid-September if it will be approved in time. Shawn Nesgis asked about the definition of trenchless excavation for the workshop. Tony said that they had kept it broad to allow for all types to be reviewed for reasonable care. Sunil Shori asked about the status of the CARCGA SSIP reasonable care document that was provided to the Dig Safe Board. Tony said that the committee that was working on that had concerns about mismarked lines and were going to have a meeting with the SSIP co-chairs and the Board committee, but SSIP said they were done with the issue. Steve Woo mentioned the liability and Tony said if everyone followed the law the excavator would be at fault for damages which is not always true. Anthony Headley asked Tony about contact information for the operator to help with finding lines. Tony stated that in the regulations about the hand tools there is also a regulation that would require operators to provide valid contact information of a person/department that could assist with finding the lines when an excavator has hand exposed and not found the line. He also said excavators would need to keep their contact information current during the life of the ticket. ## **5. CGA Update**

Ann Diamond said that registration is open for the 2021 CGA conference in Florida. She said in the past committee meetings like OCSI, Best Practices and Regional Partners were held before the actual conference started and could be attended without paying for the conference. That will not be the case going forward as educational content will be done during the committee meetings. She also said that the Infrastructure Resources global safety conference will be held in Florida next March as well. She noted that Scott Landes with Infrastructure Resources said that after the physical conference they will have a virtual conference available and those that signed up for the conference in Palm Springs this year could use their credit towards the virtual conference. Ann said that CARCGA had received a limited number of Best Practices Books – 52 this year instead of 104 - and if anyone would like one to contact her.

## **6 Notification Center Updates**

Ryan White from USA North 811 reported the numbers for the center had been wacky due to COVID-19, but they were up 9% overall in tickets with 82% being done online. He said June was the 5<sup>th</sup> busiest month ever and August 10<sup>th</sup> was their 4<sup>th</sup> busiest day ever. He said they have been monitoring ACE tickets to make sure they are truly ACE tickets and if not, they have the person cancel that ticket and get a new one. He said their office remodel is complete and now they are moving in furniture and equipment. The center is working on updating their logo. He said their partnership with the A’s has been great as their viewership is up 300%, so the Call 811 shovel on the foul pole is getting lots of exposure. Finally, he said the center is working on a concerned citizen and cross bore tickets to allow members to opt in or out to receive this type of ticket.

Ann Diamond said that DigAlert still has everyone working from home. She noted that at the June meeting she reported that the March and April ticket trend was going down but wasn’t sure if it was COVID or rain related but May was definitely COVID related and she was

afraid that that would be the trend for the rest of the year. June turned out to be the busiest month in the center's almost 44-year history and then in July the center took 3.6% more tickets than June – over 83,000. She said web tickets continue to climb, averaging 65%. She said DigAlert Direct now has training available on how to input tickets and anyone can visit [digalert.org](http://digalert.org) to register.

## **7. Committee Reports**

### **A. Board of Directors Update**

Marshall Johnson said the financials showed a current balance of \$18,645.63. Randy Charland moved to accept the financials as presented and Colette Shelly seconded. The motion carried. Marshall also said that he will have the SSIP co-chairs reach out to the Dig Safe Board on the reasonable care issue.

### **B. Subsurface Safety and Incident Prevention Committee Update.**

Steve Woo reported that the committee had continued discussions on private mark-outs. He said the committee's concerns center around where the public mark-outs end and private begins and avoiding confusion as to which is which. Discussions have included using a different color or using pink with a dot in the APWA color for the type of line. Accuracy for marking private lines was also discussed. The committee has had presentations from several locators that do private marking. The issue will continue to be explored by the committee at its next meeting.

### **C. Education Programs and Marketing Committee Update.**

Marshall Johnson reported for Michael Worster who was unable to attend the meeting. He said that the first CARCGA newsletter was included in the packet that was sent out and has been posted to the CARCGA LinkedIn and Facebook pages. He said that the committee is calling for articles and webinars for future newsletters and the CARCGA YouTube channel. There is no update on an event with Senator Hill due to the pandemic. Finally, the committee is looking at SWAG pending the Board of Directors budget approval for the expense.

### **D. Legislative and Regulatory Committee Update.**

Ann Diamond said that since the June CARCGA meeting the committee had met a few times to come up with a position on SB865 and suggested language changes on who to contact when a damage occurs. She said those suggestions were not considered and while we tried to engage with staff, we did not hear from them to continue discussion. She said the bill was put on the suspense file for the Assembly appropriations on Monday and the committee was having a meeting during the CARCGA meeting. She said that the legislative session this year was not optimal as deadlines were moved due to the virus and CARCGA was unable to truly participate with all stakeholders meeting as we had during the last round of legislation. Tony Marino said that if the bill was not out of suspense today then it was dead and that the date of August 31<sup>st</sup> for legislation to pass can't be moved as it's in the California Constitution.

### **E. Technology Committee Update.**

## **9. New Business**

### **A. CARCGA policy on use of CARCGA Name and Logo**

Marshall Johnson read the newly adopted CARCGA policy for use of the CARCGA name and logo:

*No individual, group, or entity, including CARCGA members, may infringe on, use, or reference the CARCGA name or logo in any manner, or for any purpose, which results in a personal gain, financial or otherwise, without explicit permission of the CARCGA Board of Directors. Moreover, any expression of an official CARCGA position, opinion, or interpretation in a public setting may only be rendered by an individual, group or entity having prior, explicit, permission of the CARCGA Board.*

Anthony Headley asked in what format the logo was available. Ann Diamond said that it was available in many different formats and with or without the gold around the state.

### **B. Nominations Open for Stakeholder Members – Engineering, Locator, Oil, Telecommunication, Sewer and State Regulator**

Marshall Johnson said that nominations were open for the following stakeholder groups: engineering, locator, oil, telecommunication, sewer and state regulator. He said self-nominations were acceptable and a brief bio needed to be sent to Ann. Ann added that if there is only one nominee and the nominee accepts the nomination no voting for that stakeholder industry will be done. She also said the term is for two years and nominations must be in by October 15<sup>th</sup>.

### **C. Public Awareness Programs Translations**

Ashlen McGinnis from SMUD told the group that SMUD was a bit different than most PHMSA regulated gas as they are a public entity but PHMSA has given the CPUC audit capabilities. She said that during the last audit a question of supplying their information in other languages was brought up and no one had a specific threshold of when to start providing their materials in other languages. She asked the group if their companies had a specific threshold of when to provide materials in other languages. Bob Carpenter suggested she contact Valerie Lertyaovant at SoCal Gas and Aaron Rezendez said that Courtney Jordt from PG&E could help as well. Ann Diamond said she would forward their contact information.

### **D. Municipal Utilities Not Marking Lines**

Anthony Headley asked what could be done with municipal utilities choosing not to mark their lines telling his crews that they should know where they are. Marshall Johnson suggested contacting the League of Cities. Steve Woo said municipalities can charge for marking and Sunil Shori said that if they are CPUC or PHMSA regulated they are required to mark.

### **E. CARCGA as a Single Voice for Leg/Reg**

Marshall Johnson said when CARCGA was established our mission statement was to come together and the goal was for a larger voice to include all those from small to large. He said that when legislation comes up, we have things that the group has already done and come up with solutions. CARCGA didn't fulfill what we set out to do and should have been more at the forefront of SB865. Instead of being a single voice there were different voices. He noted that issues should be brought to CARCGA and we are the experts in damage prevention. When CARCGA works together it's better. He said using CARCGA as your option to bring issues and to be heard by all stakeholders for discussion and consideration and then an agreement on the issue can be attained and provided to legislation when the same issues come up. While one may disagree with the outcome,

it's assured that it has been fully discussed. Colette Shelly thanked Marshall for his comments and concerns and for asking that everyone recommit to CARCGA as the voice for damage prevention. Bob Carpenter said he supported his comments as well.

Tony Marino said that SB865 has passed out of appropriations.

Randy Charland asked if the email from the Dig Safe Board about the reasonable care workshop could be sent out and if the CARCGA member doesn't specifically engage with trenchless excavation to send to those they may know that do. Ann noted that she had sent to all CARCGA members but would send out again with the encouragement to pass along to those that do have experience with trenchless excavation.

Aaron Rezendez noted that early adopters of the ACE tickets could be evangelists in spreading the word.
